3 **Resolution approving Department of the Environment Funding Recommendations for**
4 **Zero Waste grant awards to fourteen organizations in grant cycle period (FY 2019–**
5 **2021)**

6 WHEREAS, The Zero Waste program of the Department of the Environment provides
7 grant funding to non-profit groups; and,

8 WHEREAS, The Zero Waste grant program is dedicated to funding projects that
9 recover material from San Francisco’s landfill, thereby assisting the City in achieving its goal
10 of zero waste, and achieving this at a low cost per ton of waste diverted; and,

11 WHEREAS, In addition to helping San Francisco reach its zero waste goals, these
12 grant funded projects achieve a range of co-benefits such as creating jobs, providing
13 classroom materials for educators, securing healthy food for low-income San Franciscans,
14 and building community; now, therefore, be it,

15 RESOLVED, the Commission approves the award of Zero Waste grants, totaling
16 \$720,000 to be disbursed during FY 2019-2021 to the following organizations:
